



Need for Libraries

Our outreach shows 1 in 5 low-income schools lack awareness of book fairs and functional libraries. Boimon Mela has been crucial in introducing these elements. We plan to partner with NGOs and government agencies to create Book Corners and hold Boimon Mela bi-annually, providing diverse books and supporting library development.



Safe Reading Environments

Ourprojectshowsthatchildrenthriveinsafe, uninterrupted reading spaces. Boimon Melas have provided such environments. We plan to introduce pop-up Storytelling Stations, where facilitators read aloud to enhance listening and reading skills.



Engaging Students

In high-income private schools, 1 in 4 hesitated to host book fairs due to concerns about student interest. Boimon Mela has successfully engaged previously disinterested students. We propose pre-fair programs like Book Camps and storytelling sessions to boost enthusiasm and demonstrate the value of book fairs.



Role of Parents and Teachers

Improved Concentration

Initially, 1 in 3 students in grades 3-5 and 1 in 5 in grades 6-9 struggled with focus. Book Club sessions created a relaxed atmosphere, helping students feel more comfortable with reading. We'll continue fostering stress-free spaces to enhance focus and task completion.

Enhanced Imagination and Teamwork

Our Book Clubs boost imagination and critical thinking through engaging reading and art-based activities. With 90% of activities promoting collaboration, students develop teamwork and leadership skills, contributing to improved academic performance

Access to Quality Literature

Many students lack access to age-appropriate reading materials at home and in schools. Weekly Book Clubs introduce good literature and guided reading experiences. We'll collaborate with schools to better utilize libraries and ensure regular access to quality books.

Fostering Empathy and Well-Being

Book Clubs provide a safe space that promotes belonging and mental well-being. Discussions about characters and personal reflections foster empathy, helping students express emotions and support each other, particularly important for teenagers.



One at a Time: Re-Building School Systems in West Bengal after COVID19 is Educhange Foundation's flagship adoption program. Through this initiative, the organization adopts 1 government and low-resourced school in West Bengal school each year and through intensive intervention rebuilds its educational and academic infrastructure in a holistic and sustainable manner.


This year, Educhange adopted 'Dumdum Sarvodaya Balika Vidyapith' located near Nagerbazar, Dumdum, Kolkata in West Bengal in April 2024. We had conducted an online fundraising campaign on the platform Milaap and with your generous contributions and support we were able to accumulate a sum of almost One Lakh which helped us kick-start the program. We also have Educhange Circles consisting of individual donors who support specific projects and courses like Bridging The Gap:Communicative English. We would also like to mention Sahay Foundation for being a constant source of support and funding our Special Maths Classes.

BACKGROUND

Dumdum Sarvodaya Balika Vidyapith was established in 1957 and experienced its peak in 1997, celebrating an enrollment of 700 students. The students were diligent, excelling in both academics and co-curricular activities, including sports. They even participated in district-level competitions, showcasing their abilities and bringing recognition to the school. However, the school's fortunes started to decline around 2010, and the situation worsened during the COVID-19 lockdowns. The school faced a significant number of student dropouts due

to relocations and economic challenges amid the pandemic. Currently, the official enrollment stands at 200 students, but only around 50 students attend classes regularly. Despite these challenges, Dumdum Sarvodaya Balika Vidyapith remains committed to providing education to its dedicated students. The school administration and staff are diligently working to rebuild the school's reputation and regain its former standing. We aim to bring all the 200 enrolled students back to the school!







OUR INTERVENTION

Support Classes: Expert-led maths and science classes for class 10 exam preparation.

Communicative English: Course for class 5-9 students to enhance language skills and confidence.

Book Corner: Space with 150 donated books to promote reading habits.

Storytelling Sessions: Weekly discussions using Book Corner resources to enhance reading skills.

Science Lab Development: Building a lab for hands-on learning and experiments.

Computer Lab: Establishing a lab to improve digital literacy.

Kitchen Garden: Creating a garden for biological learning and sustainable practices.

Educational Events: Organizing curriculum-linked events and field visits.

Physical Skill Workshops: Conducting Kalaripayattu workshops for physical development.

Infrastructure Development: Enhancing classrooms with soft boards and plans for whitewashing.

Teaching Materials: Supplying teaching aids to enhance learning.

Teacher Workshops: Monthly sessions to improve teaching methods.

Home Visits: Engaging parents about the importance of school attendance.





Infrastructure Renovation:

Significant renovations are needed to create an inviting school environment that encourages regular attendance and interactive learning.

Comprehensive Assessments:

Students often rely on memorization for assessments. We are introducing creative and analytical approaches to promote critical thinking and application of knowledge.

Faculty Training on NEP 2020:

We are conducting regular workshops to help teachers understand and implement NEP 2020 strategies, focusing on multidisciplinary approaches and skill-based education.

Student-Led Initiatives:

Introducing student-led activities, like a library and events, empowers students, boosts confidence, and fosters leadership and teamwork.

Career Guidance:

Regular workshops on educational benefits and career opportunities help combat absenteeism and dropout rates, improving attendance and motivation to complete schooling.



Educhange strives to empower them with the necessary skills, exposure, resources, and knowledge to succeed in various aspects of their lives as



BACKGROUND

Sido Kanhu Mission, located at a quaint village in Arsha, Purulia, homes more than 50 children who are either orphaned, abandoned, or have a broken family. Led by Naren Hansda, a local hero, has organized all the children under one roof through his heartfelt rendition of jhumur songs, which not only uplifts their spirits but also serves as a means to sustain their needs. Through the concerted efforts of this close-knit community, the children have been successfully enrolled in nearby government schools, where they attend classes regularly but lack proper learning resources, exposure, and guidance for better educational outcomes.





OUR INTERVENTION

Communicative English Course: Enhances reading, writing, and speaking

skills for class 5-9 students, boosting confidence for higher education.

Book Corner Development: Established with ₹15,000 worth of donated ageappropriate literature to promote reading habits.

Interactive Storytelling Sessions: For grades 1-4, using Book Corner resources to improve listening, vocabulary, and comprehension through arts-based activities.

Theatre Workshops: Foster creativity and presentation skills by integrating school syllabus texts.

Dance Movement Workshops: Develop emotional regulation and motor skills through movement, interpreting syllabus texts.

Folk and Contemporary Music Classes: Expose students to cultural traditions and enhance listening skills with diverse music, including English songs.

Math Support Classes: Strengthen math foundations with doubt-clearing sessions and problem-solving guidance.

Nature Trails and Environmental Workshops: Utilize local surroundings to teach environmental awareness and nature-based education.

Film Screenings: Enhance comprehension and critical thinking through diverse narratives and global perspectives.





Overcoming Language Barriers:

About 90% of our students speak Santhali or Munda at home, while Bengali is the school language. This disconnect affects their learning. Our "Curriculum Through Co-curricular" approach uses art, movement, and games to make lessons relatable. Support classes also help students understand instructions, enhancing their learning outcomes.

Improving Learning Outcomes:

While students have basic reading skills, comprehension is often weak. Our experiential learning techniques involve hands-on activities and storytelling, fostering connections between reading and real life. This deepens understanding and cultivates a love for learning beyond memorization.

Sustainable Community Development:

Limited higher education options leave students uncertain about their futures. We provide tutoring and resources for senior students to complete their degrees, equipping them with vocational skills, digital literacy, and social skills. By encouraging a mentoring culture, we promote community development and empower students for personal and communal growth.

WAY FORWARD

Launching Our Website: We are excited to launch our official website, which will serve as a platform to share our resources, updates, and achievements. It will also provide parents, teachers, and educational institutions with easy access to our programs, events, and publications.

Publishing Children's Books: We plan to expand our publication wing of publishing contemporary children's literature in the next year and after. These books will be designed to promote literacy, local and cultural awareness, will be affordable, and foster love of reading among children.

Expanding Book Club, Book Camp, and Storytelling Sessions: We aim to extend the reach of our Book Club, Book Camp, and Storytelling sessions into more schools across the region in order to create impact among thousands of children. These programs have proven successful in cultivating creativity, improving reading skills, and fostering critical thinking, and we are committed to bringing these experiences to a wider audience of students.

Developing the Infrastructure of Sarvodaya: By next year, we plan to further develop the infrastructure of Dumdum Sarvodaya Balika Vidyapith, enhancing its facilities to create a more conducive learning environment. This includes building sustainable, child-friendly spaces that incorporate learning tools and support the holistic growth of students.
